Main Purpose of Role

Your aim is to support pupils to celebrate their strengths and learn to develop strategies to promote independent living for adulthood and to have the skill set to access employment and education beyond the school.

You will closely support pupils' academic and pastoral outcomes on Educational Health Care Plans (EHCPs) offering specialised academic tuition to students as well as structured therapeutic interventions to develop language, social interaction, and emotional regulation skills.

You will use your exceptional knowledge of the needs of students with varying social, emotional and mental health needs, to ensure they receive provision in line with their EHCPs.

The ideal candidate will be confident, enthusiastic, have excellent English skills (clear written and spoken English) and proficient reading, writing and numeracy skills, along with the ability to build good & trusting working relationships with children, teachers, parents, and carers.

Main Areas of Responsibility:

As a Higher-Level Teaching Assistant, your areas of responsibility will include:

- Taking responsibility for agreed activities under an agreed system of supervision. This may involve planning, preparing, and delivering learning activities for individuals/groups or short term for whole classes, as well as monitoring children and assessing, recording, and reporting on children's achievement, progress, and development.
- The management and development of teaching within the academy and/or management of other teaching assistants including allocation and monitoring of work, appraisal, and training.
- Taking a lead role within the academy to address the needs of students who need particular help to overcome barriers to learning.
- Providing support for students, the teacher and the academy in order to raise standards of achievement for all students, by utilising advanced levels of knowledge and skills when assisting with planning, monitoring, assessing, and managing classes.
- Encouraging students to become independent learners, providing support for their welfare, and supporting the inclusion of students in all aspects of academy life.
