

SEN Teaching Assistant Job Description

Teaching Assistant

To assist in delivering the curriculum, working in partnership with parents, teachers and the school to establish a supportive and nurturing learning environment for a pupil with additional needs.

Performance Measures

- To ensure children make progress towards their targets
- To demonstrate a commitment to building positive family relationships and professional relationships within the school

Main Duties

- To establish an effective and purposeful learning environment in partnership with the teachers and other colleagues
- To support teachers in assessing the needs of individual children
- To observe, record and feedback information on pupil performance

Other Key Aspects of the role

- To assist in creating materials for curriculum delivery and display boards
- To plan and lead one to one and small group teaching and intervention
- To promote inclusion of all the pupils in the school, including those with physical, learning and behaviour difficulties
- To assist with behaviour management for specific children within and outside the classroom
- To work with the classroom teachers to implement Individual Education and Care Plans and develop resources for pupils who have: English as a second language, speech or language impairments or behaviour that interferes with learning and relationships
- To assist pupils' social development, progress and achievement outside the classroom
- To follow the school's safeguarding policies and protocols with all pupils

Wider School Support

- To supervise pupils in the playground and dining hall when directed
- To assist with therapy. e.g. physical, occupational or language
- To maintain pupil and family confidentiality
- To attend regular meetings and training as required
- To communicate and liaise with staff, pupils, parents, local advisory board and other members of the local community as appropriate

Please note that this is illustrative of the general nature and level of responsibility of the role. It is not a comprehensive list of all tasks that the teacher will carry out. The postholder may be required to do other duties appropriate to the level of the role, as directed by the headteacher or line manager.
