JOB DESCRIPTION

School Chaplain

Grade 8 SCP 23-28

As a Church of England high school, we are unique in our area as we are the only Church of England high school for miles around. We believe that our distinct identity enables us to offer a rich and rewarding experience to all our students. Church schools aim to be both distinctively Christian and thoroughly inclusive. We serve our whole community by providing a broad and balanced education irrespective of religious affiliation or commitment. All children are welcome here, but a small minority of places are reserved for applicants who are practicing Christians.

At Hartford Church of England High School, our foundational Christian ethos is expressed on our school badge, which students wear on their blazers over their heart: Caritas et Veritas – Love and Truth. The Bible reveals a God of love and truth in Jesus Christ. Our core school values are an outworking of that in everyday life as we seek to be Happy, Achieving, Ready and Together (HART).

All staff and governors at Hartford Church of England High School share and commit to the vision to provide an education that enables 'life in all its fullness'. As the Church of England's vision for education states, we embrace the spiritual, physical, intellectual, emotional, moral and social development of children and young people. We offer a vision for all; one that embraces excellence and academic rigour, but that sets them in a wider framework.

This is worked out both theologically and educationally through the following four elements:

Educating for wisdom, knowledge and skills: enabling discipline, confidence and delight in seeking wisdom and knowledge, and developing talents in all areas of life.

Educating for hope and aspiration: enabling healing, repair and renewal, coping wisely when things go wrong, opening horizons and guiding people into ways of fulfilling them.

Educating for community and living well together: a core focus on relationships, participation in communities and the qualities of relationships that enable people to flourish together.

Educating for dignity and respect: the basic principle of respect for the value and preciousness of each person, treating each person as a unique individual of inherent worth.

The role of the Chaplain at Hartford Church of England High School is to embody all of the above by:

I. Proclaiming Christ

- Leading the prayer life of the school community
- Planning and leading Collective Worship to enable students and adults to flourish spiritually
- Developing and providing activities to mark and celebrate the seasons of the Church calendar
- Encouraging staff and students to live out the Christian faith and invest in the school values



- Developing and supporting faith based extra-curricular activities
- Helping and inspiring students and adults to experience God's Love and Truth in line with our Christian vision

2. Promoting the Christian ethos

- Promoting Collective Worship and supporting the school in its development priorities
- Supporting and promoting the school values of Caritas and Veritas alongside HART
- Working in collaboration with the Assistant Head for Christian Distinctiveness to ensure the Christian character
 of the school is part of our culture
- Supporting the delivery of morals and values aligned with Christian life that ensure all students and adults are treated well and there is an active culture of justice and responsibility
- Raising the profile of the school's Church of England foundation through the use of Christian symbols, installations, and appropriate imagery around the school

3. Pastoring in Christ's name

- Being visible and approachable across the school community
- Being available to all in the school community in a pastoral capacity
- Contributing to restorative processes as a means of promoting justice, respect and forgiveness
- Supporting key transition events throughout a student's academic and spiritual journey. This may include
 supporting the planning and of these events and speaking at them where applicable (for example: Y6 Transition
 Events and Scene Setting)
- Developing the Chapels ensuring the space is open, accessible and appealing to all members of the school community
- Promoting inclusivity for all students by providing exceptional support to the Pastoral system
- Being aware of and adaptable to world events and current affairs, offering support, guidance and information where applicable

4. Partnership

- Working alongside the Heads of Family to create Collective Worship resources, advising on how to deliver our ethos and providing support for events throughout the year
- Leading the Ethos Reps in their work in the school community and beyond
- Developing strong partnerships with all primary schools, Church of England Primary Schools, the local parish, other local churches, Chester Diocese, Chester Cathedral and other Christian organisations and charities
- Participating in extracurricular trips and visits
- Taking up opportunities for professional development and facilitating the professional development of others
- Building strong links with the Diocesan Board of Education and engaging with networking and training opportunities



Additional Responsibilities

- Attending all meetings as requested by the Headteacher or Assistant Headteacher (Christian Distinctiveness).
- Additionally undertake:
 - ⇒ Fire marshall and first aid duties where applicable
 - ⇒ Duties during the working day
 - ⇒ All professional development as required for the role
 - ⇒ Fully participation in the performance management and appraisal process
- Notwithstanding the detail in this job description, the job holder will undertake such work as may be
 determined by their Line Manager from time to time, up to or at a level consistent with the Main
 Responsibilities of the job.
